I. POLICY AND GENERAL STATEMENT

- A. Academic honesty
 - 1. Students are required to follow the UTHealth Cizik School of Nursing Academic Honesty Policy.
 - 2. Any student who commits an act of academic dishonesty is subject to discipline.
- B. A standardized examination policy will facilitate test taking.
- C. Examinations will be given over a specified period of time.
 - 1. Students are expected to be present at all exams
 - 2. Students arriving AFTER the start of the examination will have only the time remaining to take their exam.
 - 3. NO other student will be admitted to the examination room after the first completed exam is turned in.
- D. Exam type and location
 - 1. At the discretion of the course faculty, exams may be delivered electronically, via paper and pencil at a UTHealth facility, at an approved third-party location or via a third-party proctoring service.
 - 2. Students taking tests are to submit their answers electronically or turn in their examinations and answer sheets at the completion of the specified time period.
 - 3. If the student does not submit or turn in their examination, it will result in a ZERO (0) on the examination with NO make-up allowed.
- E. Students are held responsible for the content of the entire course.
- F. It is the responsibility of the student to consult individual course syllabi for the faculty preference/instructions regarding examination procedures.

- G. Extenuating circumstances
 - 1. If extenuating circumstances prevent a student from attending a scheduled exam, the student may be excused at the discretion of the faculty; the faculty MAY request documentation of the event.
 - 2. The student absence will be excused it the result of illness of the student or significant other, religious holiday, or the result of extenuating circumstances.
 - 3. All other absences will be considered unexcused.
 - 4. An unexcused absence will result in a zero (0) for that exam.
 - 5. Consult the individual course syllabus for further clarification.
- H. Excused Absence
 - 1. The faculty has the option of requiring a make-up exam or increasing the percentage that another exam is worth.
 - 2. All final exams are MANDATORY.
 - 3. Any missed final exam with an excused absence will result in an incomplete grade until the final exam is taken.

II. DEFINITIONS

- A. Excused absence: absence from a scheduled exam due to illness of the student or significant other; religious holiday; or the result of extenuating circumstances.
- B. Unexcused absence: an absence that was not excused.

III. PROCEDURE

- A. In the event of an anticipated absence, the student will notify the instructor prior to the exam to request an excused absence.
- B. Additionally, contact the instructor within two (2) days following the examination regarding the missed exam.
- C. Failure to follow the above procedures may constitute an unexcused absence.
