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Policy Title: Unprofessional* Clinical Performance

Policy

Unprofessional* practice and/or behavior in clinical anesthesia settings are grounds for failure of a nurse anesthesia clinical course. (See Policy D8110 Professional Conduct for rules regarding professional practice in the clinical settings/area).

Procedure

- A. Program administration and faculty will inform the student in writing that he/she has performed unacceptably in the clinical setting and is in danger of failing the course. The student will be placed on clinical probation.
- B. A second unacceptable clinical practice incident will result in program administration and faculty informing the student in writing that he/she has failed the course, why he/she failed and that the student will receive a grade of "F". The student will not be able to withdraw without penalty as a result of this action.
- C. Violation of safe, standard of care clinical practice, inappropriate/unprofessional behavior(s), and/or unsatisfactory clinical performance may be grounds for immediate removal from clinical practice and failure of the clinical course.
- D. Program administration and faculty will inform the student in writing that he/she may not return to clinical.
- E. Documentation of these actions will be placed in the student's file located in the Nurse Anesthesia program office and the Student Affairs Office.
